Enrolment of Younger Siblings

If anyone has younger siblings that they wish to enrol at the school please pop in and collect an enrolment form. Our school operates on the basis of continuous enrolment and places are not currently automatically offered to siblings. The Board of Management is looking at our enrolment policy at present to include a 'siblings clause' in line with Educate Together Policy. However, in most ET schools siblings need to be enrolled before a certain age to be guaranteed a place at the school.

Therefore, we would urge parents to enrol their children as soon as possible to avoid disappointment. As there is such a demand for places at the moment we are in the unfortunate situation of being unable to offer places to siblings as they were not enrolled in time and are now on the waiting list.
