The focus for our Learn Together sessions in assemblies for November /December is Human Rights. The children will be discussing this important issue with Áine and their teachers over the coming weeks.

For our younger pupils this will focus on the development if essential skills and attitudes which underpin respect for human rights. Our older pupils will explore concepts such as identity, relationships, independence, equality and perspective which will contribute to their understanding of human rights.

At the senior assembly this morning Áine and the children explored how the term Human Rights evolved and how we each play our part in upholding human rights.
