## If Your Child Misses School ...?

Please remember to send an absence note/letter with your child when they return to school after being absent. We appreciate phone messages explaining why the child is missing school but we still need a written note after receiving such a call.

## Team Teaching and Learning Support

Team Teaching is the phrase used to describe the way lessons are delivered to the children in our school. This means that 2/3 teachers might be involved in a Literacy or Numeracy hour in your child's class. Team teaching means that each teacher can be responsible for a much smaller group of children allowing them to plan activities suited to their individual needs. Sometimes (because a class of 30 children all reading at the same time can be noisy!) a teacher might take a group of children to a resource room to complete the activity. **All pupils in our school are involved in the team teaching model of support**.

Team teaching is different to **Learning support**. Learning support will be offered to your child if we feel that they are experiencing some difficulty with their learning. If we feel that your child would benefit from Learning Support you will receive a letter/phone call from the school to discuss this with you directly. We need your consent to begin learning support with your child and you will be asked to sign a form. If your child is offered learning support it may be for a short period or over the course of a school year depending on your child's needs. Learning support is usually delivered in small groups.

## **Class Meetings**

Each year the class teachers at the school organise meetings to allow parents to get an overview of what the children will be learning in school each year. This is also an opportunity to meet the class teacher and to learn about the ways in which you can support your child. Each meeting will last approximately 30 minutes and the timetable for the meetings is as follows:

Attendance at these meetings is very important and appreciated by the staff and the children.

#### Lost/Damaged Books

Last year a total of 80 reading books, that were sent home, were either lost or damaged. These books need to be replaced at considerable cost to the school. As homework has begun this week please ensure that all reading books are properly looked after and returned to the school each day in your child's folder. The class teacher will keep a record of each book that is sent home and when it is returned. If a book is not returned or is badly damaged a note requesting €8 payment will be sent home.

Our guided reading programme in the school has been hugely successful over the last few years and your support in helping to look after the books is very much appreciated.
