- Word of the Day here is a list of the next 8 words that the children will be learning.
 - o Pasture, upheaval, x-ray, quake
 - o Moral, compound, aggressive, joist

Write the word, look up the meaning of the word using a dictionary and put the word in the sentence, list any possible antonyms and synonyms. The main idea of this task is that the children should understand the word and be able to tell you how to use it in the correct way. Feel free to provide additional words for them as you like or perhaps challenge them to write a paragraph using more than one word. In 4^{th} class we would often use our 4 Words a Day in a drama improvisation- you could have fun with this at home too! \odot

- Comprehension Treasury D Pg 40 'Boeing 747'. Q A and B
- Treasury D Pg 58 'A Walk on the Moon'. Q A, B (Orally answer Q D)
 - o Please remember to answer in full sentences.

Allow your child to read the text and then ask them a few questions to see if they have understood. Encourage them to use a dictionary to look up any unfamiliar words (perhaps these could become their extra 'word of the day').

- Using Words Treasury D Pg 15 Q A, B, C
- Phonics- Treasury D Pg 18 Q A and B, (Orally answer/discuss C and D)
- Grammar-Treasury D Pg 19 Q B ad C (Orally answer/discuss A)
- <u>Free Writing</u> 4th class have a fantastic imagination when it comes to free writing! This activity gives children the opportunity to create their own stories/comic strips that lets them exercise their own creative minds and practice writing coherent stories for other readers to enjoy!
- <u>Narrative Writing-</u> This can link nicely with the above free writing. We have been working on Narrative Writing in class and children have or very nearly completed their own stories 'Under the sea themed' (lots of selfediting involved).

Please encourage your child to self-edit their work, they can write a 1^{st} story draft, highlight errors then- write a 2^{nd} story draft with previous errors correct!

- Top Tips!
 - ✓ Use a title, beginning, middle and end
 - ✓ Reread work to ensure each sentence makes sense
 - ✓ Spell check
 - ✓ Use paragraphs
 - ✓ Capital letters, commas, full stops, speech marks
 - √ 1-3 pages per narrative story
- Narrative writing suggestions (I would love to see some illustrations when your story is complete!)
 - Imagine a giant box is delivered to your front doorstep with your name on it. What's inside and what happens when you open it?
 - o I woke up one morning with a mermaid tail
 - o An alligator as a pet
 - You flew to outer space and discovered a new planet
 - You discovered that you have a super power
- <u>Poetry</u> The wonderful and funny Kenn Nesbitt is our 4th class poet!
 Check out his website and have a listen to him read aloud his poems. Try to encourage your child to learn one of these off by heart and perform.
 We do a lot of this in school! (Kids-Maybe you could choose our next class poem? Remember your good posture and projection!)
